



From the Police Department

Now that winter is here, the Police Department will be enforcing the following City Ordinances. Failure to comply with these ordinances could result in a misdemeanor citation being issued. If everybody will abide by these rules, it will help make our streets and sidewalks safer for everyone.



6-1-3: ALL NIGHT PARKING REGULATIONS: (year round) No person shall park a vehicle on any street for a period of time longer than one hour between the hours of two o'clock (2:00) A.M. and seven o'clock (7:00) A.M. of any day, except physicians during emergency calls; and further provided that any resident of the City may request permission for all night parking when the same is required by emergency or other unusual circumstances. The Police Department, for good cause shown, may grant such permission. The Police Department shall be the sole judge as to the necessity and requirements for the granting of such permission.

7-2-2: PROHIBITED ACTS: C. Unlawful Deposit of Snow or Other Material on City Streets: It shall be unlawful for any person removing snow from a sidewalk or driveway leading from a business or residence to deposit said snow or other material in a street maintained and plowed for purposes of snow removal by the City.

7-2-6: REMOVAL OF SNOW: It shall be the duty of the owner or occupant of private property fronting upon a public sidewalk to remove all weeds and noxious vegetation from such property and in front thereof to the curb line of the street and to keep the sidewalks in front of such property free from litter, snow, ice or obstructions.

Public Works Items

Christmas Tree Pick Up: Trees will be picked up on January 7, 2009. Please have your tree out by the curb early Wednesday morning. Please have your tree cut into 4 foot lengths or it will not be picked up. If your tree is covered with snow or not by the curb, it may get missed. Crews will only go down each street once, so please have your tree out and ready the night before. Residents may take Christmas trees to the Green Waste Recycling Facility located at the Davis County Landfill, 1997 E. 3500 N., Layton, from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday. This service is provided free of charge. Artificial trees will not be accepted for free disposal, but may be deposited at the landfill for a \$5.00 fee. For more information, call 614-5600.



Snow Plowing - If we get any snow this year, we will plow it the same as previous years. First, we clear the main roads. These include 800 N., 1300 N., 2000 N., 2300 N., 2400 N., 2575 N., 250 W. and 475 W. You can usually find a clear path out of town before work and school starts. The roads within the subdivisions are next, followed by cul-de-sacs, dead ends, parking lots and sidewalks around our parks and buildings. When doing subdivisions, we usually make 2-3 passes down each side of the road. You may want to take note of this before you start shoveling out your driveway approach.



Debit/Credit Cards

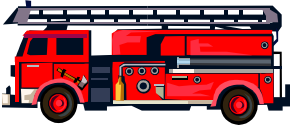
During the past few years we have received a lot of comments from residents asking to use debit or credit cards to pay their utility bills, court payments, etc. We are happy to say that the City Office will be accepting cards for both utility and court payments by January 2009. Since we will be using a processing company for the transactions, there will be a convenience fee charged for using the system. The fee is not charged or collected by Sunset City, but is collected by the processing company to cover their costs associated with processing the debit/credit card transaction. You will be able to make your payments either at the front counter, over the phone or through our website.

Business Licenses

Fire Department



Greetings and Happy Holidays to all! Here's a little safety information to consider during this holiday season to keep everyone safe from harm and loss. We at the Sunset City Fire Department practice our skills in trainings every week so we can respond to your call for help no matter what time of the day or night you call. To keep us from having to respond we ask that you take a note of the following things to watch for this season and all throughout the year.

- 1) When putting up decorations take the time to check any that require electricity to work such as power cords for wear, worn out wire covers that expose bare wire and mechanical devices to make sure the motors are working properly.
- 2) Check decorations you plan to hang or place on high surfaces prior to doing so to limit time needed on ladders or roof tops.
- 3) If you need to fix any item that you have to use a ladder for, make sure you have someone at the base of the ladder to support it, especially during icy conditions. (Note: Always have some help when doing anything above ground so if something should happen, they can call for help immediately.)
- 4) When picking out a tree, please abide by the following for purchasing a fire safe tree:
 - a. If buying a "living" tree (one that has been cut down for your use), ensure it is fresh by shaking the tree. If the pine needles stay on the tree, it is fresh. Make sure you keep the tree well watered to avoid it drying out too quickly, increasing the fire hazard. Use only approved lighting recommended for live trees. This should be noted on the box or wrapping the lights come in. Never use lights that are for outdoor use only as these will have a higher intensity that can cause a fire indoors.
 - b. When buying an artificial tree, check that it is fire resistant. It should be noted on the box it comes in or the manual that comes with it. Be sure to follow manufacturers recommendations at all times.
- 5) When using space heaters, buy one that has safety features automatically shutting off if it tips over and has a safety breaker so it shuts off if there is a power surge. If you use any that heats with fuel, always fill it in a well ventilated area away from any heat source and allow any spillage to evaporate before using. We strongly recommend buying a newer model that does not use any type of flammable fuel. Always follow manufacturer's instructions, especially on fire dangers and distances needed away from anything that could be ignited by the heater's heat.
- 6) When using a fireplace for holiday decorations, make sure you have a good fireplace cover made of metal and heat tempered glass to keep the flames inside the fireplace. Only hang fire resistant and flame retardant items from the mantel. Remember to never put anything with a low flashpoint over any type of heat source as it could ignite from the radiant heat of the fireplace.

The Sunset Fire Department is recruiting fire fighters. All firefighters are paid per call and must live within the City or in close proximity. Visit www.sunsetfireandrescue.com for information.

Citizen Corps Council

The Sunset Citizen Corps Council works in cooperation with the Police and Fire Departments to prepare Sunset City for emergencies. This Council meets on the first and third Wednesdays in the Sunset Room of the City Building. This year the Citizen Corps Council and associated organizations have sponsored the pedestrian flag program, participated in the Sunset Fun Days Parade and fireworks display, held Neighborhood BBQs every Friday evening in June and August and sponsored a Health, Safety and Emergency Preparedness Fair.

In 2009 we will be organizing our next Citizen Corps Program "Sunset on Watch", which was formerly known as "Neighborhood Watch". Our next CERT training will begin in March and only costs \$10.00 for the training, after which you will receive a CERT backpack with supplies. This training takes several weeks to complete and teaches first aid, triage, search & rescue and more.
