Spring Water Bills – Remember that if you do not have a radio read meter, your meter has not been read through the winter months. Households are charged the minimum of \$16.15 per month for 10,000 gallons. When the meters are read in the spring, any usage over 10,000 gallons per month will be included on this bill. Debit/Credit Cards - Residents are now able to pay their utility bills with a debit/credit card. Payments can be made at the counter, over the phone or by visiting our website. Sunset uses a processing company to make this possible. The processing company charges a fee which is collected directly by the processing company and not passed onto Sunset.

From the Police Department

Now that Spring is almost here, the Police Department will be enforcing the following City Ordinances. Failure to comply with these ordinances could result in a misdemeanor citation being issued. If everybody will abide by these rules, it will help make our City safer for everyone.



4-4-1 – Weeds and Junk Ordinance

- A. Do not allow the existence of injurious and noxious weeds, garbage, refuse, unsightly objects or structures on any piece of property within the City.
- B. Do not leave in a place accessible to children any discarded refrigerator or other container with an airtight door or lid without first removing the door, lid or locking device.
- C. Do not leave in your yard scrap metal, wastepaper products, discarded building materials, abandoned vehicles, machinery or their parts, etc. A vehicle is considered abandoned if it is not registered 30 days after expiration or it is wrecked or inoperable for 120 days or more.

4-3-4 – Garbage Cans – Do not put out your garbage can earlier than the day before collection and be sure to take it back in within 24 hours after collection.

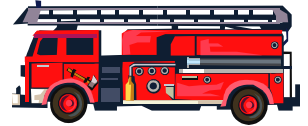

The Utah poison Control Center (UPCC) was established in 1954 and has responded to more than 1 million calls for assistance. The UPCC is a program of the University of Utah, College of Pharmacy. In 2008, the UPCC received over 56,000 reports of poison exposures, 60% of these cases involved children under 6 years of age with 4% of cases involving adults over 59 years of age. The UPCC was able to safely and effectively manage 77% of the poison exposures at home with telephone follow-up.

TIPS FOR PARENTS WITH SMALL CHILDREN

Install child-safety locks on cabinets that house cleaning supplies, medicines, cosmetics, chemicals and other poisons. Never assume a cabinet is too high for a curious, climbing toddler.

Keep all household products in their original packages. Packaging includes useful first-aid information in the event of accidental exposure or ingestion. If you purchase these products in bulk quantities, buy a smaller size of the same product and use this container for refills.

Use child-resistant packaging properly by closing the container securely after each use. Remember, however, that this type of packaging is "child-resistant," not "child-proof." It's not a substitute for keeping products securely out of reach of young children.

Read and follow the product-label directions. Pay particular attention to products whose labels include the words "Caution," "Warning," "Danger" or "Poison."

Take out only the amount of cleaning product needed for the job at hand. Store the rest away securely so there's no chance that small explorers will get their hands on it.

Don't mix household cleaning products. This could release harmful vapors or cause other chemical reactions that can have dangerous results.

Don't leave cleaning buckets unattended. Even those with a small amount of liquid pose a danger to "top-heavy" toddlers. If the child falls into a bucket, it may not tip over and he or she could drown. The product could also spill onto a child's sensitive skin.

Schedule cleaning during "down times" such as nap time or when children are in school or on a play date.

Immediately clean up any spillage. Quickly and safely dispose of rags, paper towels, etc., that you have used for cleanup.

Avoid distractions or interruptions when children are present during cleaning. If you answer the door, take the child with you. If the phone rings, let the answering machine do its job.

Know where to call for help. Post the Poison Control Center phone number (1-800-222-1222), along with other emergency numbers, by every land phone in your home and enter them into your cell phone's address book.

Get a Jump on Spring with Weatherization

With the promise of warmer weather in the not-too-distant future, many people are anticipating the arrival of spring and a welcome relief from high heating bills and cold homes. Besides warmer weather, a great way to cut annual heating costs is to take advantage of home weatherization before winter rolls around again.

The Tri-County Weatherization Assistance Program is committed to energy conservation and safety in the homes of income-qualified applicants. People living in owner-occupied properties, as well as rental properties (with landlord approval), are eligible for assistance and are encouraged to apply. Tri-County Weatherization accepts applications throughout the year. As the warmer season approaches, applications normally decrease so now would be an advantage for those qualified to apply for the program.

Once an applicant's name comes to the top of the list, a state certified energy auditor is sent out to the person's dwelling. That inspection determines what work will be done on the residence. Some of the typical weatherization measures completed are:

- Furnace tune-up, repair, or replacement
- Water heater tune up, repair, or replacement
- Window replacements
- Door repair or replacement
- Insulation (attics, walls, crawl spaces, pipes, ducts, water heaters, etc.)
- Compact fluorescent lighting replacement
- Refrigerator replacement
- Air sealing and weather-stripping
- Green tag inspection on furnace and water heater



These measures can be done at no cost to the property owner.

The goal of the program is to reduce energy consumption by 30% or more. The Weatherization Assistance Program uses funding from the U.S. Department of Energy, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Questar Gas Company, and Rocky Mountain Power to complete energy saving measures on residential properties.

The Davis County Health Department manages the Tri-County Weatherization Assistance Program for all income-qualified residents in Davis, Weber, and Morgan counties. Please contact outreach specialist Debbie Haycock at 1-877-882-4799 or (801) 451-3362 or visit
